But despite BRMC feeling shaken up, there is cause for us to be grateful, including being thankful for many things we have done, often quite informally, to nurture and encourage us and reach out to our community:

As in each of this author's books (he of War Horse fame), a whole range of emotions are felt by readers. I laughed and felt very sad at times, regardless of whether it was a fact or fiction. Another unusual feature is a strong emphasis on the importance of the conservation of our world. We must all do whatever we can.

From all I have learned from Michael Morpurgo, I believe him to be a softly spoken unassuming West Country man, at the same time he has determination to spotlight his convictions for the benefit of us all. Yes, I'm a fan!

Running Wild talks about a young boy, Will, having a longed for treat ride on an elephant, on an Indonesian beach. The scenery and weather appeared perfect until a tsunami hit. It was January 2004. Will survived and that was thanks to Oone the elephant's natural instincts. Those two formed a strong bond and so the story follows.

As in Will's life and most of ours, a majority of choices and experiences confront us out of the blue, and often culminate happily, but we have to accept not everything will. We all have challenges and I say this to myself as much as to anyone else. Things seem not to get easier as we get older, in fact the reverse! We need God's help and so thankfully we only have to ask and accept and that help is there. "I will not forsake you" – **thanks be to God!**

He did not forsake young Will either! As far as I recall there is no mention of Christian faith in Running Wild, but I see the connection with animals and nature generally, as a sign of God's hand and the author surely felt that too.

## FINANCIAL STATEMENT

I am in the process of preparing the end of year accounts which I hope to present to the Church Council at the end of September. But, at the moment, I am able to give the Church community some pointers as to the state of the accounts. As of the 18th September the following figures show the amount of money in the various Church bank accounts and investments held at TCMP.

Lloyds	£ 2,217.97
CFB1	£ 6,581.63
CFB2	£25,511.10
Endowment Funds	£24,101.00

Just to explain....it appears that the Church has a lot of money but the CFB1 account is used to pay the assessment and the next quarter (paid in advance) of £6,011 has to be paid before the end of the month.

The CFB2 account contains the money left by Stella and the grant from the Circuit towards our new toilet block. We were given permission to use some of the grant money to pay last quarters assessment otherwise we would have been in breach of our obligations. The amount was £5,000.

The Endowment Funds are in 2 parts, The Edward Bryant and Joyce Powell trusts. We can use the Joyce Powell Fund for anything that the Church would like to do but the Edward Bryant can only be used on youth programmes.

-10- The Church has the following commitments, i.e. expenditure. The assessment £6,011 per quarter, the telephone and Wi-Fi, the electricity, the gas, the water, flowers and the organist. Based on past years we can estimate the following.

It should be pointed out that the church has only survived financially because we have not used any gas and we were able to use money given to us for the toilet project. This project is now being held in abeyance, which is a great pity.

Also, while I have been treasurer, since 2005/6, the giving from the congregation and the gift aid associated with giving has never covered our assessment.

Paying for the other costs has always come under the heading of fundraising/donations/lettings of which the church, up until the pandemic, has been quite successful.

The Church has to find new ways of replacing all the efforts that COG's and the fundraising activities put in to cover the shortfall. I am sure, that having survived Covid, the task is not beyond the efforts of the church. I hope my assessment does not frighten you but we have to be realistic about the present situation.

## **\*\*MILK BOTTLE LIDS\*\***

Firstly a big thank you to all of you who have saved up your milk bottle lids and passed them on to me to pass on to Westergate MC. Sadly, the gentleman who emptied the vast bin full of bottle tops and took them to the recycling place has recently passed away. Unfortunately, there isn't anyone who is able to take over from him, and so I'm sorry to say that it's the end of passing them on to me.

I did try to find a more local solution for us but only came up with the following:

The E.Y.E. Project (which stands for Eco, Young and Engaged) has a collection point at **St Paul's Church in Chichester**, where clean milk bottle tops can be dropped off into collection bins there (situated outside the building). They will then be passed to a recycling company, who pay per ton, which the church donates to the Chestnut Tree House Children's Hospice, which cares for children with life-limiting conditions.

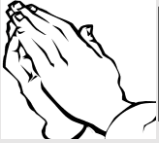

## Reported on ABC News Channel, Australia.....
