WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

4th September - Wait on the Lord : Psalm 27:14

David said "I would have lost heart unless I had believed.....wait on the Lord......and he shall strengthen your heart". The word 'wait' is a Hebrew word that is used in making rope. Every rope starts with a strand and every strand added increases its strength. Every time you wait on the Lord, you are adding another strand to your rope, all the time getting stronger. If you're hanging by a thread, spend some time with God and ask him to add another strand to your rope. Every time you spend time with Him, you will see Him turn your thread into a strong rope!

11th September - God is still King - Psalm 11:4

The Psalmist said "when the foundations for good collapse, what can good people do?" When problems come, a loved one becomes ill, we encounter loss or the world news is too much for us, the best thing we can do is remember that **God is still King and is watching over us!** Speak it out loud! Nothing escapes God & nothing is too small for him to care about! He works to a plan which will prosper us & bring us hope, not harm us (Jeremiah 29:11). When we cry 'where are you God?' He answers 'I am with you and will watch over you....I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you'. Gen 28:15.

18th September - Go overboard for Jesus - John 21:7

At dawn, Jesus stood on the beach, He called out 'have you caught any fish?' 'No' was the reply, so Jesus told them to throw their nets over to the right. Then John said to Peter 'It's the Lord!' and Peter jumped into the water and went towards Jesus. The nets were full & Peter had to choose between staying with his boat or going to see Jesus. He didn't think twice.

We also have that challenge: stay with our 'catch', our accomplishments, our successes, or go overboard for Jesus.

Paul realised that his true identity didn't lie in his accomplishments, but in his relationship with Jesus. Are we ready for a new assignment for Him? Ready to go overboard for Jesus? Whatever we need God has it! Whatever we give up, God repays many times over!

25th September - A taste for God's word - Psalm 119:103

As we grow up, our tastes change. Foods we hated, we love and we may lose our sweet tooth for a more savoury preference. We begin to enjoy flavours and textures that we rejected in our youth. We all want to eat healthily & might try cooking from scratch rather than the easy processed foods. But cooking from scratch is hard work and it's so much easier to put a pizza in the oven. In cooking & bible reading we need willpower and perseverance to get started and to keep going. But God's word is our soul food! We need to feed on scripture. Becoming a faithful bible reader.... begins as a discipline, continues as a duty and develops into a delight. 'How sweet are your words.....sweeter than honey to my mouth'.
